REMINDER: At present, the Law School permits law students to earn up to six (6) credit hours in non-law school graduate courses (500 level or above) toward the 90 credit hours required for law school graduation, except that students in a concurrent degree program are given credit for nine (9) hours. No student shall be eligible to enroll for academic credit in non-School of Law courses unless such student shall have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.6/2.8 [2.45/2.65 for students that matriculated prior to June 9, 2008] at the beginning of the semester in which the student is enrolled in such class. A STUDENT MUST EARN A GRADE OF "B" OR BETTER FOR LAW SCHOOL CREDIT TO BE GIVEN. Credit earned in independent research counts against the 6 hours of graduate course work allowed for law students. Credit will be given for undergraduate courses only if a suitable graduate level course is not available and there is a clearly demonstrated relationship between the undergraduate course and the student's law school work. The advice and consent of the law professor to whose field of endeavor the course relates would be required.
