‡ Non-resident students may apply for in-state residency by establishing "bona fide" residency in Illinois, and are granted in-state residency for the next semester after fulfilling the 6 month residency period. (Example: Student files an application for in-state residency with supporting documentation by July 18, 2009, to receive in-state tuition assessment for Spring 2010 semester.)

❖ Federal Funds (Stafford subsidized and unsubsidized loans) are available to law students enrolled in six credit hours or more. In order to apply for Stafford loans, the **FAFSA** must be filed (available at www.fafsa.ed.gov). The SIU Financial Aid Office will prepare award letters for newly admitted law students beginning mid-March. For continuing law students, award letters will be prepared beginning mid-June. At that time you will be able to view and accept your financial aid award via the online SIU System.

❑ Amount of student contribution that is not met by federal loans. Students may meet the needed amount by securing outside funding through private/alternative educational lenders (i.e., SIU GRADUATE PLUS, Access Group, Citi Bank, Sallie Mae, Wells Fargo, Key Loans). None of the preceding are preferred lenders.
