The program was begun by President Obama to allow young leaders an opportunity to use leadership skills and to gain access to the public sector. The Internship works in several offices of the White House including the Department of Scheduling and Advance, The Office of Cabinet Affairs, The White House Communications Department, and The Office of the First Lady to name a few. The Program is an unpaid internship and housing must be found by the potential intern. For those students who will be available this Spring the program runs from January 18, 2010, until May 7, 2010.
